1904 schedule vs. NesCom

□ In 1904.2 PAR extension request we said:

2. Why an Extension is Required (include actions to complete): By December 2020, the Working Group expects the draft to enter the IEEE SA balloting phase. A 1-year extension is required to complete the balloting and perform Mandatory Editorial Coordination (MEC)

- It is unlikely that we will be able to enter the IEEE SA balloting phase if this is the last 1904 WG meeting before the NesCom meeting on 12/2/2020.
- However, we may be able to complete MEC and start forming IEEE SA balloting group before the NesCom meeting.
- Should we submit draft D2.1 to MEC after November 19th TF2 meeting? If yes, we need a [conditional?] motion.

Forming Balloting Group

- A balloting group must consist of a balance of a variety of interests, with no domination by any one group or company.
 - The goal of balance is to have representation from all interested parties, but to avoid an overwhelming influence by any one of those parties (i.e., any category should not exceed 1/3)
- The only requirements to join a balloting group are
 - an interest in the subject
 - an IEEE Account
 - and active IEEE SA membership or payment of the per-ballot fee.
- Individual balloting groups should have at least 10 members to help ensure this balance.
