Group Hotel Registration Policy

Obtaining an Invitation Letter for Use in Canada Visa Applications

Ericsson Canada can provide you with a letter inviting you to attend the September 2014 IEEE 802.1/3 Joint Interim. You must register for the upcoming session in order to obtain an Invitation Letter. Once your registration has been approved you may at any time select the link to "Generate a Visa Letter" from the event portal navigation bar. You will be asked to log in using the same UserID and Password that you used to register.

If you completed registration successfully, you will then be asked to provide some additional information that is necessary for your Invitation Letter:

- Your Date of Birth
- Your Place of Birth
- The Nationality of Your Passport (i.e. the issuing country)
- The Passport Number
- The Passport Expiration Date

Once this information has been accepted your personalized letter will be generated in Acrobat PDF format and then displayed on the screen for printing and saving. In addition, a copy of the generated visa letter pdf format file will be sent as an attachment in an email to your email address.

These letters have the Ericsson logo at the top, are properly signed by a representative from Ericsson, and should be printable on any common personal computer printer.

Entering Canada – Identification Requirements

Identification requirements for U. S. citizens and permanent residents

If you are a U.S. citizen, ensure you carry proof of citizenship such as a passport, birth certificate, a certificate of citizenship or naturalization, a U.S. Permanent Resident Card, or a Certificate of Indian Status along with photo identification.

For all modes of entry, we recommend you carry a valid passport for all travel abroad, including visits to Canada from the United States. Your airline or alternative transportation authority may require a passport, as it is the only universally accepted identification document.

Citizens and permanent residents of the United States who are members of the NEXUS or FAST programs may present their membership cards to the CBSA as proof of identity and as documents that denote citizenship, when arriving by land or marine modes only.

All visitors arriving from or transiting through the United States are encouraged to visit the [U.S. Customs and Border Protection Web site](#) for information concerning the U.S. Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative, and the requirements to enter or return to the United States.

Identification requirements for International Visitors

The Government of Canada requires that all travellers carry a valid passport because it is the only reliable and universally accepted travel and identification document for the purpose of international travel.

International transportation companies such as airlines may require travellers to present a passport. Therefore, travellers may face delays or may not be allowed to board the aircraft or other mode of transportation, if they present other documents.

When you enter Canada, a border services officer may ask to see your passport and a valid visa (if you are arriving from a country for which one is required). We remind all travellers you must carry proof of citizenship such as a birth certificate, a certificate of citizenship or naturalization or a Certificate of Indian Status along with photo identification.

Ottawa is the capital city of Canada and is centrally located in the province of Ontario. The Ottawa International Airport offers daily direct connections to over 30 Canadian, U.S. and European Centres. Ottawa is also serviced by Canada's train service, VIA Rail, and accessible by a number of major highways.

Driving Directions From the Ottawa Airport to Brookstreet Hotel:

- Exit the Airport onto the Airport Parkway
- Exit at Hunt Club Road going west
- Follow Hunt Club Road towards the Highway 416
- Get on the 416 North towards Ottawa
- At the end of the 416, follow the 417 West towards Kanata
- Exit #138 March Road, turn Right onto March Road
- Turn right onto Solandt Drive
- Take your first left onto Legget Drive

Kanata Research Park: Located around the Brookstreet Hotel and a short walk from the Ericsson site the business park offers variety of take-out and eat-in food (including sushi, Indian, pizza and tex-mex).

Weather: September marks the end of summer and the start of autumn. Days can be quite warm and nights cool. Average Daily Highs and Lows for September, 20°C/68°F 9°C/48°F

Time Zone: Ottawa is located in the Eastern Standard Time (GMT - 5 hours) time zone.

Language: English and French are the official languages of Canada both are spoken in Ottawa.

Currency: Currency can be exchanged at banks or at currency exchange stations. Some hotels and other merchants accept foreign currency, but it is recommended that visitors exchange currency before they arrive. Most businesses accept debit cards and credit cards as a form of payment.

Automated Teller Machines (ATMs): are located in banks and in various other locations throughout the city. They are usually available during and outside of regular banking hours, although often with an additional service fee.

Tippling: For good service at a restaurant, a tip of 15% of the pre-tax bill is customary. Some restaurants add a service charge to the bill, especially in large groups, in which case further tipping is not expected. Tipping is also customary in bars, salons/spas, and taxis.

Taxes: For up-to-date tax information, visit the Canada Revenue Agency website at www.cra.gc.ca/visitors.

Smoking: In Ontario and Quebec, smoking is prohibited in all enclosed public places and workplaces, including restaurants and bars.

Electricity: Outlets and voltage (110 volts) are the same as in the United States. Small appliances such as hair dryers, irons, and razors can be used in Canada.

For those from other countries, adapters are required for electrical appliances.

The frequency of electrical current in Canada is 60 Hz.

Telephone: In Ottawa: The area code for Ottawa and the surrounding area is 613. Before dialing locally, use 613 and then the 7-digit phone number. In Gatineau: The area code for Gatineau is 819.

Mobile Coverage: Mobile phones or tablets that can roam on the North American bands in either GSM/HSPA (800/1900MHz), CDMA (800/1900MHz) or LTE (1700/2600MHz) will be able to roam in Ottawa.
