The IEEE 802.1 Working Group (WG) would like to thank the Ultra Ethernet Consortium (UEC) for the information provided in the liaison statement on Congestion Signaling (CSIG). We welcome your interest in working with us on a potential specification of CSIG in the IEEE 802.1 WG.

As next steps, we would appreciate it if you could:

1. Provide the most recent revision of the draft CSIG specification with us.
2. Provide technical details on the use of the CSIG signal values.

Following review of the provided information, the IEEE 802.1 WG may identify potential new IEEE 802.1 standardization activities, which may help clarify the framework for further interaction and collaboration between our organizations.

Any entity may submit an application for an EtherType™ to the IEEE Registration Authority (<https://standards.ieee.org/products-programs/regauth/ethertype/>). For instance, to obtain an EtherType for an IEEE 802.1 standard, the IEEE 802.1 WG would submit a request to the IEEE Registration Authority as part of an IEEE 802.1 standardization project specifying a protocol requiring an EtherType assignment.

Note that the IEEE 802 work is open and contribution driven. Participation is on an individual basis and technical discussion can be conducted based on individual contributions. We meet at Plenary and Interim

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sessions and hold electronic meetings in-between sessions as listed in the WG calendar:

We look forward to further interaction between our organizations.
