Dear P802.16.2a Balloting Group:

Thank you for your participation in the Sponsor Ballot of P802.16.2a/D3. The ballot closed on 11 January 2003. The results are, in summary:

- 41 Approve
- 2 Disapprove
- 6 Abstain
- 13 Not Voting

By virtue of these numbers, the ballot is considered to have passed, pending comment recirculation. We received 112 comments, of which 4 were Disapprove comments. Resolutions were developed by a Ballot Resolution Committee composed of Task Group 2 of the IEEE 802.16 Working Group on Broadband Wireless Access. The committee, chaired by Phil Whitehead, met at a regular session of the IEEE 802.16 Working Group on Broadband Wireless Access on 13-16 January 2003. We are requesting that the IEEE Balloting Center initiate a ten-day recirculation.

Following comment resolution, one of the Disapprove voters informed us that he was satisfied and converting his vote to Approve. The other Disapprove voter was not satisfied with the resolutions of his three Disapprove comments.

We are including a new draft (**P802162a_D4.pdf**) in the ballot package. Also included is a detailed list of the 112 comment resolutions (**80216-03_02r2.pdf**). Should you prefer the database version of the resolutions for use with the program *Commentary*, it is available at <<u>http://ieee802.org/16/docs/03/80216-03_02r2.zip></u>. Technical comments identified by a voter as *not* part of a Disapprove vote are marked as "Technical, Non-binding." Those marked as "Technical, Binding" are considered to support a Disapprove vote. Comments marked "Technical, Satisfied" were submitted as Binding but were resolved to the expressed satisfaction of the voter.

Please pay particular attention to Comments 80, 95, and 97, as these are the three outstanding Disapprove comments. You will find these in the PDF comment list on pages 85, 100, and 102.

Document C802.16.2a-03/01 (C802162a-03_01.pdf), which is referenced in the comment resolutions, is also included in the ballot package.

Please take this opportunity to review the package. You need not reply; if you do not, your current vote will stand. Based on these comment resolutions, you may change your vote. You may also submit additional comments that respond to these resolutions. If you wish to re-vote or comment, please keep the deadline in mind. Instructions have been provided by the IEEE Balloting Center.
