Task Group C Session #27 Minutes

IEEE 802.16 Session #27

8-11 September 2003

Due to meeting room constraints, and as previously scheduled, Task Group C did not meet on Monday 8 September or Tuesday 9 September.

On Tuesday 9 September, the Task Group C Chair worked on resolutions to sponsor ballot comments for P802.16/Conformance02/D3. He developed proposed resolutions to 120 of the original 136 comments, noting that 23 were obviously intended for the P802.16.2a ballot. Those 23 comments were formally rejected by Task Group C and referred to the P802.16.2a Ballot Resolution Committee (IEEE 802.16's Task Group 2).

From 9:00 am until 11:45 am on Wednesday 10 September, Task Group C reviewed the Chair's proposed resolutions and worked to resolve the remaining sponsor ballot comments for P802.16/Conformance02/D3.7 of the 16 remaining comments were resolved.

From 1:15 pm until 5:00 on Wednesday 10 September, Task Group C resumed by working on the comments from Working Group Letter Ballot #12. Preliminary input on those comments had by then been received, via e-mail, from the document's Technical Editor, Lars Lindh. 26 of the 35 comments for Letter Ballot #12 were resolved. The TG switched back to the sponsor ballot comments and resolved the remaining 9 comments, also accepting and resolving 7 late comments. Adjourned at 5:35 pm.

From 9:15 am until 10:30 am on Thursday 11 September, Task Group C discussed the current comment status and resolved to send P802.16/Conformance02 to Sponsor Ballot recirculation. With 9 unresolved comments, the decision of what to do for P802.16/Conformance03 was unclear.

From 1:15 until 1:30 pm, resolved two more comments for P802.16/Conformance03, leaving 7 remaining comments. 4:30-5:30 pm: developed and approved two motions for the 802.16 Closing Plenary:

- "To accept IEEE 802.16-03/40r1 as the resolutions of the P802.16/Conformance02 Sponsor Ballot comments, initiate a recirculation, authorize Task Group C to resolve comments from any resulting recirculations, and presubmit the resulting draft to RevCom by the deadline of 21 October. The Ballot Resolution Committee will include Ken Stanwood, Carl Eklund, Lars Lindh, and any other Working Group members who volunteer by 19 September."
- 2. To approve the formation of a Ballot Resolution Committee to resolve comments from Working Group Letter Ballot #12 and any followup recirculations, completing recirculation before Session #28. The Ballot Resolution Committee will include Ken Stanwood, Carl Eklund, Lars Lindh, and any other Working Group members who volunteer by 19 September."
