 - FDD Downstream center frequencies
 - FDD DS, FDD US and TDD frequency bands
- The majority of the time was spent on recommendations on specifications for exclusion sub-bands
 - Recommendations for the Task Force are provided on subsequent slides
- All Open Issues are captured in the Open Issues list that is updated after conference calls

Recommendations on Exclusion Sub-Bands

- Exclusion sub-band can be on the lower portion of the channel, the upper part of the channel, or within the channel
- 2. Exclusion sub-bands are configured by the operator
- 3. Exclusion sub-bands are for reducing the channel bandwidth, protection of legacy cable services, for controlling known egress/ingress in specific spectrum.
- 4. An exclusion sub-band is a group of contiguous subcarriers

Recommendations on Exclusion Sub-Bands

- 5. Define a sub-group of sub-carriers that is 200 kHz wide
 - For example, 4 subcarriers for an 4k FFT, or 8 subcarriers for an 8k FFT
- 6. Exclusion sub-bands consist of a multiple of contiguous sub-groups, with a minimum exclusion sub-band of five sub-groups (bandwidth of I MHz)

Next Steps

- Vote in the Task Force to adopt the recommendations of the Ad Hoc
- Agree on recommendations in these areas
 - FDD DS, FDD US, and TDD Frequency Bands
 - Channel Center Frequencies
 - OFDM windowing
 - Other
