

#### Other guidelines for IEEE WG meetings

- All IEEE-SA standards meetings shall be conducted in compliance with all applicable laws, including antitrust and competition laws.
  - Don't discuss the interpretation, validity, or essentiality of patents/patent claims.
  - Don't discuss specific license rates, terms, or conditions.
    - Relative costs of different technical approaches that include relative costs of patent licensing terms may be discussed in standards development meetings.
      - Technical considerations remain the primary focus
  - Don't discuss or engage in the fixing of product prices, allocation of customers, or division of sales markets.
  - Don't discuss the status or substance of ongoing or threatened litigation.
  - Don't be silent if inappropriate topics are discussed ... do formally object.

#### **Participation in IEEE 802 Meetings**


Participation in any IEEE 802 meeting (Sponsor, Sponsor subgroup, Working Group, Working Group, etc.) is on an individual basis



#### Overview of IEEE 802.3 Standards Process (1/5)-Study Group Phase




## Overview of IEEE 802.3 Standards Process (2/5) – Task Force Comment Phase




## Overview of IEEE 802.3 Standards Process (3/5) – Working Group Ballot Phase


# IEEE P802.3cm 400 Gb/s over Multimode Fiber Task Force Objectives

- 1. Support full-duplex operation only
- 2. Preserve the Ethernet frame format utilizing the Ethernet MAC
- 3. Preserve the minimum and Maximum FrameSize of current Ethernet standard
- 4. Provide appropriate support for OTN
- 5. Specify optional Energy Efficient Ethernet (EEE) capability
- Support a BER of better than or equal to 10-13 at the MAC/PLS service interface (or the frame loss ratio equivalent)
- 7. Support a MAC data rate of 400 Gb/s

# IEEE P802.3cm 400 Gb/s over Multimode Fiber Task Force Objectives (continued)

- 8. Define a physical layer specification that supports 400 Gb/s operation over 8 pairs of MMF with lengths up to at least 100m
- Define a physical layer specification that supports 400 Gb/s operation over 4 pairs of MMF with lengths up to at least 100m

  - Editors' Update on Draft 2.0. Proposal to have consistency between current 400GBASE-SR4.2 specification (Clause 150 D2.0) and 100G BiDi specification. Further discussion of modal noise penalty allocation.
- April 25, 2019: 21 attendees
  - Editors' Update on Draft 2.0, 58 comments received. Updated proposal for consistency/commonality between 400G-SR4.2 and 100G BiDi; discussion on possibility of combing this proposal with proposed potential increase in MN penalty contributions. Additional detail and curve-fitting from Pepeljugoski's 2008 modal noise simulations work to generate additional MN penalty recommendation for 400G-SR4.2. Review of previous proposals to have equations/formulas-based specifications for noise (instead of emphasizing power budget).
