#### **Harold Moore**



- Harold Moore passed away at age 95 on September 23, 2023.
- Harold became a Committee Member in 1983 and was awarded the status of IEEE Fellow in 1997.
- Harold spent the first 37 ½ years of his long and distinguished career working for Westinghouse, much of that leading the development of shell form design technology.
- In 1959 Harold co-authored the famous purple book (Transformers for the Electric Power Industry).
- In 1984 Harold became the Engineering Manager at the ABB factory in Alamo, Tennessee.





#### **Harold Moore**



- In 1989 Harold began a consulting career, counseling buyers, users, and manufacturers of Power Transformers.
- He earned a level of resect reserved for a very few unique individuals in our industry.
- He was fair, but firm, and design engineers quickly learned that when Mr. Moore was coming for a design review, every calculation and every decision should be checked and double-checked.
- Harold Moore made a significant difference in our industry. He will be missed.





## Ken Skinger



- Ken Skinger passed away at age 82 on July 25, 2023.
- Ken became a Committee Member in 1995.
- Ken graduated from the University of Connecticut with a degree in Engineering. Early in his career, he was employed by General Electric, which led him to live in many places across the United States. This helped to develop his love for traveling, which he would pursue for the rest of his life. Eventually, he returned to New England as Vice-President at Stone and Webster Inc., in Boston, MA.
- He also graduated from New England School of Law in Boston MA, and was a seated member on the bar of the Supreme Court of the United States, where arbitration was his forte.





## Ken Skinger



- After retirement from Stone and Webster Inc., Ken went on to found his own firm, Scituate Consulting Inc., which he maintained until his death.
- Ken was an active member of many professional organizations, such as Massachusetts Society of Professional Engineers and the National Society of Professional Engineers, and of course the IEEE PES Transformers Committee.
- Ken was a Boy Scout, and, as a teen, earned the rank of Eagle Scout with a certificate signed by Dwight David Eisenhower.



### **Lars-Erik Juhlin**




- Lars-Erik Juhlin passed away at age 80 on October 29, 2022.
- Lars-Erik became a Committee Member in 1996.
- He initially trained as an electrician, but later went on to study Civil Engineering, then on to earned a Masters degree in Electrical Engineering.
- In 1969, Lars-Erik joined ASEA, and his 40 years of HVDC system engineering experience included main circuit design, EMC, as well as control and protection.





### **Lars-Erik Juhlin**



- From 1988 to 1992 Lars-Erik was the technical manager for the New Zealand DC Hybrid project.
- Just prior to his passing, Lars-Erik was a Senior Specialist within ABB HVDC system design involved in major HVDC development projects.
- He was a member of Cigre, and an active member the Transformers Committee's HVDC Subcommittee.





## **Ray Bartnikas**



- Ray Bartnikas passed away at age 86 on September 13, 2022.
- Ray became a Committee Member prior to 1980 and was awarded the status of IEEE Fellow in 1977.
- He received a BSc in Electrical Engineering in 1958, a Masters degree in 1962, and PhD in 1964.
- His early career was spent studying ionization discharges in cavities and dielectrics in cable insulation structures.
- In 1968, Ray joined IREQ, engaging in research on partial discharge phenomena and aging of dielectric materials. In 1980 he was appointed scientific director of the materials laboratory.
- Ray authored hundreds of scientific and technical papers, and published
   2 books.





## Ray Bartnikas



- Ray was an adjunct professor at the University of Waterloo, the Ecole Polytechnique de Montreal, and McGill University. Beginning in 1995 he was a visiting professor at the University of Rome La Sapienza, Italy.
- He was the recipient of many prestigious awards, including the IEEE
  Canada McNaughton Medal recognizing his contributions to the
  engineering profession in Canada, and in 1999 he was invested as an
  officer of the Order of Canada, a distinction rarely given to engineers.
- Ray served on several IEEE, IEC, and ASTM committees.
- He was a Life Fellow of IEEE (1997), ASTM (1985), the Institute of Physics (UK), and the Royal Society of Canada (Academy of Science division).





#### **Don Duckett**



- Don Duckett passed away at age 79 on January 25, 2022.
- Don became a Committee Member in 1999.
- Don was an electrical engineer working on transformer designs and software programming for most of his career.
- He developed two patents and was the recipient of the Thomas Edison award.
- In his spare time, Don was an avid ham radio operator and a participant of local and national Emergency Response coordination when needed.






- Many people work very hard to help the Transformers Committee achieve its goals.
