San Diego Zoo

Cabrillo National Monument on Point Loma

The park offers a superb view of San Diego's harbor and skyline. At the highest point of the park stands the Old Point Loma Lighthouse, which has been a San Diego icon since 1854. A statue and museum in the Visitor Center commemorate Juan Rodríguez Cabrillo's exploration of the coast of California. In a former army building, an exhibit tells the story of the coast artillery on Point Loma. From late December to early March, migrating gray whales can be seen off the coast. Native coastal sage scrub habitat along the Bayside Trail offers a quiet place to reflect and relax. On the west side of the park is a small but beautiful stretch of rocky intertidal coastline.

San Diego Basics

In 1542, Portuguese explorer Juan Rodriguez Cabrillo sails into San Diego Bay, under the flag of Spain and declares it a possession of Spain. At that

time an estimated 20,000 native peoples known as the Kumeyaay live in the San Diego area. Two Spanish ships sail into San Diego Bay in 1769 and establish a settlement near the present site of Old Town. The settlers build "Mission San Diego de Alcalá", officially establishing San Diego as a Spanish settlement. This is the first of a chain of 21 missions established along the California coast.

After the Spanish-American War ended in 1848, a treaty sets the new boundaries between the U.S. and Mexico, and San Diego officially becomes the first American city. Since that time, San Diego continues to grow and prosper and to be known as "America's Finest City". The leading industries are Bio-Sciences, Communications, Computer and Electronic Manufacturing, and Environmental Technology. There are 342.4 square miles within the city's limits, 70 miles of coastline, and a population of over 1.2 million. The NFL Chargers and the MLB Padres both call San Diego their home. Attractions include Balboa Park, the Del Coronado Hotel, the Palomar Observatory, the Birch Aquarium, and the world famous San Diego Zoo. Average temperatures in downtown San Diego range from 55-68 degrees and can change 8-12 degrees from day to night.
