

"Productive Meetings Using the Internet"

1. Abstract

Web-based conferencing can provide significant opportunities for performing critical standards work within the IEEE Transformers Committee. While our semi-annual meetings are excellent opportunities to develop standards in a face-to-face environment, making worthwhile progress between meetings offers a significant opportunity to spread-out our work throughout the year.

The IEEE has a member service to support Internet Conferencing that uses Microsoft Live Meeting as the "virtual meeting room." This and other online meeting services, allows interactive meetings among users in multiple locations. Most of these services require some type of setup (special software or a web portal) for the meeting organizer, and the attendees typically only need a reasonable speed connection, meeting details (web address and password), and a telephone.

In the technical presentation, Microsoft will demonstrate the various features and benefits of their new product, "Office Live Meeting". In addition, a demonstration workshop will be provided for attendees to get actual experience on using Office Live Meeting effectively.

2. Learning Objectives

<u>Monday Presentation</u> - Attendees will learn the basic concepts needed to participate in an Internet Conference, which will include:

- IEEE-supported solution for member Internet Conferencing
- Core functions and capabilities of the Microsoft Office Live Meeting software
- Set up of a typical Live Meeting connection
- Communication and sharing key information between users

<u>Tuesday Workshop</u> - Attendees will participate in a "Hands-on" Internet Conferencing workshop, using the Microsoft Live Meeting solution. Attendees will learn:

- View basic information to begin the process of setting up an Internet Conference.
- Procedure for accessing Live Meeting
- "How To" navigate through the various features of Live Meeting
- Methods to communicate and share information through Live Meeting
- Understanding where to find resources to support training and information on Internet Conferencing

<u>Notes</u>: Monday is a typical "presentation" environment, except that the main presenter will be heard on speakerphone and the presentation will be viewed through a web portal.

Attendees of the Tuesday workshop are encouraged to bring a laptop PC with a wireless card to access the Internet and participate in the mock demonstration conference. Anyone without a computer will be able to follow along with the video presentation.

3. Learning Outcomes

This tutorial will provide the attendee with a better understanding of how to:

- Receive and process Internet Conferencing meeting invitations
- Participate in Internet Conferences by logging in and accessing Microsoft Office Live Meeting through the Internet
- Create and Manage Live Meetings from Outlook or Lotus Notes Calendars
- Upload Power Point presentation slides and other documents
- Share presentations and documents with colleagues remotely

The desired result of the 2-day Presentation and Workshop will be to open the door for Transformers Committee participants to utilize web-based tools to aid in more effective standards development. Members present for the session will be able to take advantage of the IEEE's Internet Conferencing solution and utilize online tutorials and technical support provided by the Internet Conferencing service provider, Microsoft Live Meeting.

4. Presenter Biographies

<u>Greg Becker</u>: Greg Becker is the Live Meeting Specialist at Microsoft for major accounts on the east coast. He is a web conferencing and collaboration veteran of over 15 years. He has been at Microsoft for the last 2 years focusing on Office Live Meeting. Previously, Greg worked at Interwise Web Conferencing for 3 years and 10 years at Lotus\IBM focusing on Lotus Notes, Sametime, and Smartsuite. He is a graduate of Boston College with an MBA.

<u>Rich Bakes</u>: Rich Bakes is the Microsoft account manager for the IEEE. Rich supports all Microsoft solutions and presently Rich manages many Microsoft customer contracts. Tour of Historic Vicksburg

See the white columned mansions along the mighty Mississippi River. Vicksburg's architecture is among the most diverse in the state. With styles that range from Antebellum Greek Revival to turn-of-the-century Tudor Revival, Vicksburg has truly unique architecture. Formal gardens with fountains, gazebos and courtyards grace the exterior of many homes reflecting the beauty and history of the city. Various residences are listed on the National Register of Historic Places, and as a Mississippi Landmark and Vicksburg Landmark.



Vicksburg National Military Park

The Park was established by Congress in 1899, to commemorate one of the most decisive battles of the American Civil War, the campaign, siege and defense of Vicksburg.



The Vicksburg campaign was waged from March 29 to July 4, 1863. It included battles in west-central Mississippi at Port Gibson, Raymond, Jackson, Champion Hill, Big Black River and 47 days of Union siege operations against Confederate forces defending the city of Vicksburg. Located high on the bluffs, Vicksburg was a fortress guarding the Mississippi River. It was known as "The Gibraltar of the Confederacy." Its surrender on July 4, 1863, coupled with the fall of Port Hudson, Louisiana,

divided the South, and gave the North undisputed control of the Mississippi River.

Lunch at Anchuca Garden House

Anchuca, a Choctaw Indian word meaning "happy home," is one of the most significant antebellum homes in Vicksburg. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, this impressive Greek Revival landmark represents the first columned mansion in Vicksburg. Surrounded by stately live oaks and located in the heart of Vicksburg's Historic District, Anchuca was built in 1830 by local politician J. W Mauldin. In 1847, Victor Wilson, a local coal and ice merchant, added the columned front and the two-story dependency in back.



Come and enjoy lunch in the Garden House surrounded by the graceful trees and with a poolside view.

Mynelle Gardens

From a simple garden started over a half-century ago, Mynelle Gardens stands today as a botanical wonderland, wildlife sanctuary, and haven for songbirds. Mynelle Gardens began



as a private garden created by Mynelle Westbrook Hayward and was acquired by the City of Jackson in 1973. It is a seven-acre collage of several distinct gardens, with winding pathways, cascading pools, and distinctive bridges which lead you across the pond to an island oasis. It typifies the southern garden with features worth emulating in our own backyards.

The gardens feature azalea and camellia trails and daylily displays, as well as hundreds of perennials and annuals in

natural landscape settings. The gardens change with the seasons, even with the time of day, but the mood is always tranquil.

Craftsmen's Guild Center on Natchez Trace

The Craftsmen's Guild of Mississippi, Inc. was founded in 1973 as a non-profit organization of artisans and others interested in preserving and promoting the folk, traditional, and contemporary crafts of Mississippi and in encouraging the highest standard of excellence in these crafts. Informative exhibits and live demonstrations involve visitors in the artist process. In the sales gallery, you will discover a vast array of items, from Choctaw Indian crafts to fine pewterware handcrafted by Mississippi artisans.

Gail Pittman Pottery

Influenced by work from Italy and Portugal, Gail Pittman began making ceramic pieces as gifts, then later for sale in 1979. In the early 1980's, she began participating in the Canton, Mississippi, Flea Market where people from all parts of the country buy handcrafted goods from the artisans there. During most of the early 1980's, Gail produced her craft on the kitchen table at home. The Gail Pittman line of hand-painted dinnerware and accessories has indeed made a journey.

Lunch at the University Club

The University Club is a distinguished private club where members may meet their friends, entertain business and social guests and enjoy excellent food and personal service. Located atop AM South Bank Plaza, Jackson's tallest building, offering a panoramic view of downtown Jackson, Mississippi.
